# BJP plans big for August 15



The plans were revealed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at a meeting of the BJP parliamentary party on yesterday. The BJP is planning to mark the 70th year of India's Independence with a grand celebration stretching over a week from August 15 to 22, with rallies of two-wheelers called Tiranga Yatra in every constituency where the party has an MP.

The plans were revealed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at a meeting of the BJP parliamentary party on Tuesday.

“Mr. Modi spoke on two issues... one is related to the fact

that the last two sessions [of Parliament] have seen increasing debate and work being done. This means MPs should now concentrate on reading up on the issues coming up in Parliament and try to raise the levels of public discourse. The second is related to celebrating the 70 anniversary of Independence,” Parliamentary Affairs Minister Ananth Kumar said.

The celebrations would include rallies with two-wheelers, with riders holding aloft the national flag. Sources said Mr. Modi wanted something that was “visible and would help foster the spirit of nationalism in the younger genera-

tion.”

Union Minister M. Venkaiah Naidu has been tasked with working out the details. “Mood is good. Keep it up. But observe caution,” Mr. Modi reportedly told the party leaders. The party leaders also gave Mr. Modi two standing ovations for his “successful” foreign tours, including his address to the U.S. Congress and the decision of two countries to confer their highest civilian honours on him.

External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj gave a detailed account of his foreign travels between the last session and the current one.

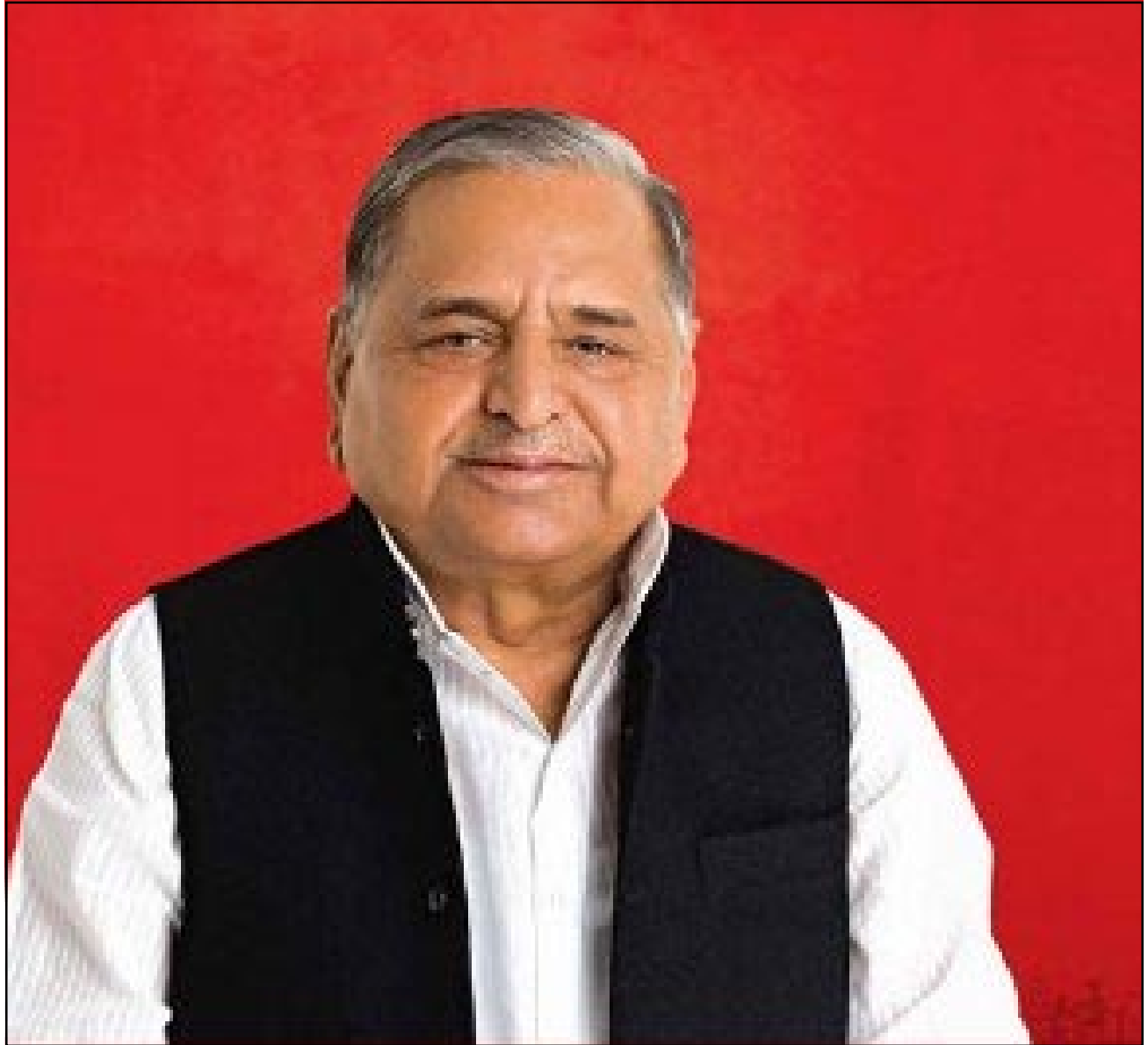

# Concurrent monologues are not dialogue

A couple of readers have argued that my columns often stray into the domain of journalistic rules, codes and literature to discover reasons to justify the newspaper's stand and fail to accord the necessary weightage to their criticism. They claim that I am silent about some of the criticisms that have a resonance in the social media. One of them felt that having a personal and intuitive system of classification of mails from readers is a divisive approach, and that it does not help in representing all readers uniformly and without prejudice. It seems that they are not prepared to concede space for domain expertise, which flows from the experience of handling complaints on a day-to-day basis.

Are there compelling reasons for not addressing the criticisms that float in the blogosphere and social media? Yes, there are at least three irrefutable reasons that prevent me from tackling the rants in cyberspace. One, I am mandated to address criticisms that emanate in the form of formal letters to the Office of the Readers' Editor. Two, it is important to stay the course by upholding the newspaper's code of editorial values and not subject it to the whims of vested interest groups who are hyperactive in cyberspace. Three, as The Guardian's editor-in-chief Katharine Viner recently observed, "social media has swallowed the news — threatening the funding of public-interest reporting and ushering in an era when everyone has their own facts."

Last week, this newspaper carried a first lead story and an editorial on the Supreme Court's verdict on the use of the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958 (AFSPA) against criminal action for acts committed in disturbed areas. The respective headlines for the news report and the editorial were: "SC ends impunity for armed forces" and "Ending impunity under AFSPA". A section of social media activists thought that The Hindu had got its headlines wrong and that it failed to recognise the difference between 'immunity' and 'impunity'. They went to the extent of lamenting the general decline of the quality of written English; the sloppiness in today's prose, and the inadequacies of the news desk in handling copy.

Before explaining why the headlines given by The Hindu desk are perfect, let us first understand both AFSPA and the recent verdict of the apex court. Sanjoy Hazarika, who was a member of the Justice Jeevan Reddy Committee to review AFSPA, has pointed out that it is a bare law with just six sections and the most damning are those in the fourth and sixth sections. While the former enables security forces to "fire upon or otherwise use force, even to the causing of death" where laws are being violated, the latter says no criminal prosecution will lie against any person who has taken action under this act. In other words, immunity was guaranteed to the armed forces by law for certain forms of excess force in difficult situations. The Supreme Court's judgment has neither revoked the law nor declared any of its sections contra-constitutional. What the court has done is to tear down the cloak of secrecy about unaccounted deaths involving security forces in disturbed areas. As the report in this newspaper records the judgment serves as a judicial precedent to uphold civilian and human rights in sensitive areas under military control and removes the concept of "absolute immunity" from trial by a criminal court if an army man has committed an offence. The two important takeaways from the judgment are that the AFSPA will remain in the statute books confirming a certain amount of immunity for the armed forces in the disturbed areas and that immunity cannot be a licence for impunity. In this context, the use of the word "impunity" in the headlines for the news report and the editorial is not only correct but also brings out the essence of the judgment. The writers of this newspaper were not "ignoramus[es] not to know the difference between impunity and immunity". Ms. Viner succinctly explained the present reality. She wrote: "Now, we are caught in a series of confusing battles between opposing forces: between truth and falsehood, fact and rumour, kindness and cruelty; between the few and the many, the connected and the alienated; between the open platform of the web as its architects envisioned it and the gated enclosures of Facebook and other social networks; between an informed public and a misguided mob." These arguments do not negate the need for a sustained dialogue with readers. On the contrary, they reaffirm the importance of meaningful dialogue and the care one has to take to ensure that it is not derailed by the decibel level. From the myriad responses, I try to sift the real complaints from the rants and good implementable suggestions from certain kite-flying exercises. In this evaluation process, the covenant between readers and the newspaper is strengthened by mutual respect and constant dialogue. Good journalism has intrinsic rules of engagement with the readers in which the public sphere is not vitiated by acrimony, but enhanced through dissent, dialogue and debate. It is not a prime time manufactured outrage, which is fleeting in nature and seldom revisited, but an act of fostering common good.

# Understanding the controversy surrounding Zakir Naik

Zakir Naik has been under the scanner of Indian law enforcement authorities ever since Bangladesh asked for an investigation into his speeches and his writing, following a claim that a terrorist involved in the recent terror attack in Dhaka was his follower who was inspired by his speeches.

Mr. Naik's speeches are aired on 'Peace TV', run by his Mumbai-based Islamic Research Foundation. Britain and Canada have banned Mr. Naik from visiting their countries several years ago while Malaysia banned his lectures fearing that they could instigate inter-racial tensions.

Born in October 1965 in Mumbai, Dr. Naik attended the Kishinchand Chellaram College in Churchgate, and later studied medicine at Topiwala National Medical College, and BYL Nair Charitable Hospital.

In 1991, he began Da'wah, which literally means proselytising of Islam. Dr. Naik then founded the Islamic Research Foundation (IRF) inspired by Ahmed Deedat, an Islamic preacher who met him in 1987.

The 50-year-old is known for his almost-eidetic memory, which allows him to quote chapter and verse from the Koran, the

Bhagavad Gita, and the Bible. He has often debated preachers and experts from other religions on his TV shows, and impressed them with his knowledge of Hindu and Christian scriptures.

Dr. Naik's Islamic teachings and speeches have not gone unnoticed in the Muslim world. His critics often point out how his speeches have disparaged the Shia and Ahamadi sects of Islam. The Sunni-majority Saudi Arabia, which is considered the cradle of the extremist Wahabist theology, awarded him the King Faisal International Prize in March 2015 for "service to Islam."



How has Dr. Naik defended his speeches?

Facing heat over his “hate speech”, Dr. Naik said his statement “urging all Muslims to become terrorists” had been taken out of context and that he is totally against terrorism and the killing of innocent humans.

“Many of the news channels in India are showing a clipping where I am saying that every Muslim should be a terrorist. Whenever anyone wants to malign me, they show the clipping.”

“This clipping, yes it is me saying it but it is out of context. I said a terrorist is a person who terrorises someone. I also gave an example that a policeman terrorises a robber. So, for a robber a policeman is a terrorist. In this context, every Muslim should be a terrorist to the anti-social element,” Dr. Naik said.

Rubbishing a report in Bangladeshi newspaper Daily Star that he inspired one of the perpetrators of the Dhaka carnage to go on a killing spree, Dr. Naik sought to put the blame on “other speakers” who misguide Muslims in the name of Islam.

“Regarding me being shocked that a Bangladeshi was inspired by me, I would say no I wasn’t shocked... I agree I do inspire people close to Islam but every fan may not follow everything I say. Once a person comes close to Islam, there are possibilities he starts hearing other speakers,” he said.

“Today, as we are aware, there are some people who misguide Muslims and in the name of Islam, they encourage them to kill innocent people, which is totally against the Quran. I totally disagree that I inspired this act of kill-

ing innocent people. There is not a single talk of mine where I encouraged one to kill another, whether Muslim or non-Muslim,” he added.

How did the present controversy get political?

As Dr. Naik came under the scanner, senior Congress leader Digvijaya Singh was in the BJP’s line of fire after a 2012 video — showing him praising Dr. Naik at an event to promote communal harmony — surfaced. The video in which Dr. Singh said Dr. Naik is a “man of peace” triggered a slugfest between the BJP and the Congress.

Security personnel were deployed outside Dr. Naik’s IRF office at Dongri area in South Mumbai as a precautionary measure in the wake of the escalating row over his alleged hate speeches.

Separatist leader Yasin Malik, on Friday, came out in support of Dr. Naik, saying Muslims in Jammu and Kashmir stand with him and claimed an “unwanted and ugly campaign” had been initiated against the controversial Islamic preacher.

“It is a deliberate attempt of witchhunt to suppress Muslims and Islamic institutions in India. This vicious campaign against a peaceful Muslim scholar is actually vindicating our point of view that Muslims in India are no longer safe and secured,” the Jammu Kashmir Liberation Front chairman claimed.

Has the govt. intervened?

Dr. Naik’s IRF has come under the scanner of the Home Ministry, amidst allegations that funds from abroad received by it have been spent on political activities and inspiring people towards radi-

cal views.

A senior Home Ministry official said an investigation has been ordered into the activities of IRF, which was registered under the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA). An online petition has been filed with the Home Ministry, listing all the allegations against IRF as well as its chief, Zakir Naik.

Has the govt. found evidence suggesting his speeches incite violence?

An official has claimed that an intelligence report had indicated that the content of Peace TV, in which Dr. Naik regularly appears and gives sermons, is “not conducive” to the security environment in the country and poses “security hazard.” New Information and Broadcasting Minister, M. Venkaiah Naidu, had called Dr. Naik’s speeches, as being reported in the media, highly objectionable.

Any past controversies?

Some of his speeches have been controversial. In 2008, in a broadcast on Peace TV, he claimed that the terror attacks of September 11, 2001 in America were an “inside job.” In 2010, the U.K. barred him entry for his alleged “unacceptable behaviour.” Peace TV is banned in India, but several local cable operators continue to show it.

Dr. Naik’s lawyers claim there is no offence to be made out. “If he has talked about Osama bin Laden in one of the speeches that in itself does not constitute a charge or offence against him. If one bomber [in Bangladesh] says he was inspired by Dr. Naik’s speeches, how can he be held accountable,” said Dr. Naik’s lawyer Mubin Solkar of Solkar & Associates.

# A quick and healthy commute

It is peak hour traffic. You are stuck in an endless traffic jam. You are wishing for something magical, that does not take much time and energy and lets you get from point A to B in quick time. The Spero electric bike, created by Milltex Engineers, a Coimbatore-based firm claims to offer a comfortable alternative to the urban commute crawl.

Manikandan, one of the company founders says, “We were looking at finding solutions for urban commute. We were looking for green solutions, especially with the growing demand for green technology and wanted to build something that offers good performance too. That was the idea that resulted in the range of Spero electronic bikes. We

travelled to Europe and tried to incorporate many features. We have focussed on performance and not focused only on the bike being a cleaner energy option. I have worked in manufacturing for many years. I was very comfortable with handling machines, sourcing materials etc. and that helped in setting up the electric bike as well.” He adds, “We launched it with the help of a crowd sourcing campaign. The bike can go up to 30 kilometres per hour, is equipped with five gears and powered with a 48KV lithium-ion battery. We also use technology that lets you charge the battery when you pedal. The motor can be used to assist users especially in course of long rides. It goes into cruise control once

you maintain a particular speed for 10 seconds. The battery can be charged from a regular 5amp socket, similar to your phones or tablets and can be used to drive for up to 100 kilometres on a single charge. On low charge, the pedals will switch to manual mode.”

Mani contends, “These functions ensure that you can use it a cycle for exercise and a workout and can use as a bike for an easier commute. We have tested the bike in many conditions. The battery is detachable and can be recharged within three to four hours.” He points out, “We have used standard bicycle tyres, cables, and guards. You can continue with normal repairs at your neighbourhood mechanic.”

# All you need to know about the GM food controversy

Last week, over a hundred Nobel laureates shot off a letter to NGO Greenpeace calling its campaign against genetically modified (GM) crops “misleading” and “unscientific.” The letter has re-ignited the debate over how safe it is to consume GM

a growing global population. “Organisations opposed to modern plant breeding, with Greenpeace at their lead, have repeatedly denied these facts and opposed biotechnological innovations in agriculture. They have misrepresented their risks, ben-

wide as also new scientific findings. The letter wants Greenpeace to abandon its campaign against GM crop in general and Golden Rice in particular. It says Golden Rice, a genetically modified variety of rice infused with Vitamin A, is a must

What does the letter say?

Addressing Greenpeace, the United Nations, and governments across the world, the letter points to how global production of food will have to double by 2050 to meet the demands of

How have opponents of GM crops responded?

Environmentalist Vandana Shiva, founder of Navdanya, an organisation promoting organic farming, is clear that GM crops contaminate the environment and the letter by the Nobel winners is merely an opinion, and not an authoritative study to go by. In a written response to The Hindu, Ms. Shiva referred to the

backlash the letter had received from several agriculture researchers and experts internationally. She cited Devon G. Peña, an anthropologist at the University of Washington, Seattle, and an expert in indigenous agriculture, who noted how the signatories were “mostly white men of privilege with little background in risk science, few

with a background in toxicology studies, and certainly none with knowledge of the indigenous agro-ecological alternatives.” Ms. Shiva further said that the laureates’ letter relied for its impact entirely on the supposed authority of the signatories. Referring to a tweet from Philip Stark, Professor of Statistics at the University of California, Berkeley, she said the signatories comprised: “One peace prize, 8 economists, 24 physicists, 33 chemists, 41 doctors”. She also shared details as to how Greenpeace activists were stalled from attending the Washington press conference where the let-

ter in question was released, as one of the security managers for the event John Bryne was a former head of corporate communications for Monsanto, the GM seeds giant. Thus tracing the entire episode to a GM lobby-driven public relations exercise, Ms. Shiva said the letter should be taken with a pinch of salt.

Further Greenpeace has de-



nied accusations that it is blocking genetically engineered ‘Golden’ rice. Its spokesperson from South East Asia, Wilhelmina Pelegrina, told The Hindu that golden rice has failed as a solution and isn’t currently available for sale, even after more than 20 years of research. “As admitted by the International Rice Research Institute, it has not been proven to actually address Vitamin A Deficiency,” she said, further adding: “Corporations are overhyping ‘golden’ rice to pave the way for global approval of other more profitable genetically engineered crops. Rather than invest in this overpriced

public relations exercise, we need to address malnutrition through a more diverse diet, equitable access to food and ecogriculture.”

What is the science behind GM crops?

Ever since the discovery of the DNA double-helix model by Watson and Crick, scientists realised it was possible to manipulate the DNA features of an organism to create new traits in them by borrowing genes from other organisms and mixing it with

theirs. In the case of GM food, scientists insert into a plant’s genome one or several gene from another species of plant or even from a bacterium, virus or animal. This is to inject desired traits such as pest-resistance or Vitamin A (as in the case of golden rice).

Is GM food unsafe?

Most studies on the safety of GM food are heavily debated; with the result that it is hard to conclude they are unsafe. The International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) classified glyphosate, a herbicide that goes with Monsanto’s Roundup Ready product, as



“probably carcinogenic” in 2015. However, this has been challenged by food scientists. The herbicide ensures that only the weed dies and not the crop itself, as the GM food is modified to resist glyphosate. In a review paper of GMO safety assessment studies, environmental scientist Marek Cuhra has shown that glyphosate-tolerant GM food plants accumulate glyphosate residues at unexpected high levels. Minimum residue levels of glyphosate allowed on GM food has been notched up due to increased use of this herbicide on the glyphosate tolerant GM food crops, said Kavitha Kuruganti, an activist associated with ASHA – Kisan Swaraj Alliance. “The way the plant resists the herbicide has allowed more residues to remain on the plant, so this has increased exposure to glyphosate among GM food consumers,” she said.

Till date the most controversial study around safety of GM food has been on GM corn by French molecular biologist Gilles-Éric Séralini. In a 2012 journal paper, he had shown that rats fed GM corn and the herbicide Roundup developed tumours. But his journal paper was withdrawn after its data was shown to be flawed. A study released by the Japanese Department of Environmental Health and Toxicology, based on a 52-week feeding of GM soybeans to rats, found “no apparent adverse effect in rats” in 2007. In 2012, scientists from the University of Nottingham’s School of Biosciences released a review of

12 long-term studies and 12 multi-generational studies of GM foods, concluding there is no evidence of health hazards from GM food. The European Commission too funded 130 research projects on the safety of GM crops and could not find anything that could prove the risks from GM crops.

Is there more to the GM controversy?

It isn’t just about safety. There are arguments against GM food that are economic and social in nature. Advocates of organic farming like Vandana Shiva have voiced serious concern about multinational agribusiness companies such as Monsanto and Bayer taking over farming from the hands of small farmers, which includes several poor women in developing countries like India. This would mean loss of autonomy over the manner in which agriculture itself is practiced, with increased dependence on GM seed companies and herbicides manufactured by them, putting financial strain on farmer households.

There are also concerns regarding loss of food biodiversity if corporate food varieties begin to flood the markets. In a note published on the Navdanya site, Ms. Shiva wrote that Golden Rice is less efficient in providing Vitamin A than the biodiversity alternatives that those grown by indigenous farm-

ers. She also wrote that GMO ‘iron-rich’ bananas have less iron than turmeric and amchur (mango powder). “Apart from being nutritionally empty, GMOs are part of an industrial system of agriculture that are destroying biodiversity, and we are losing access to the food systems that have sustained us throughout time,” she wrote.

However, scientists in the U.S. and elsewhere are firm that GM food can resolve the hunger challenge in the developing world, as the Nobel Laureates’ letter states. They also speak of the benefits of insect-resistant food crops that can increase farm productivity for farmers.

The GM scene in India

Though India has resisted GM food production till now, Ms. Kuruganti said there have been instances of GM food being imported into the country (including corn, baby food and breakfast cereal, which have been introduced without adherence to relevant labelling laws). While a Directorate General of Foreign Trade notification in 2013 addressed the issue of labelling by requiring those importing GM food to explicitly mention it in their labels, in the case of home-manufactured products like edible oil, there are chances of GM cottonseed oil being mixed with other edible oil without any labelling, she said.

Though no State government in India has permitted commercial cultivation of GM food till now, field trials for 21 GM food crops, including GM vegetables and cereals, have been approved by the government.

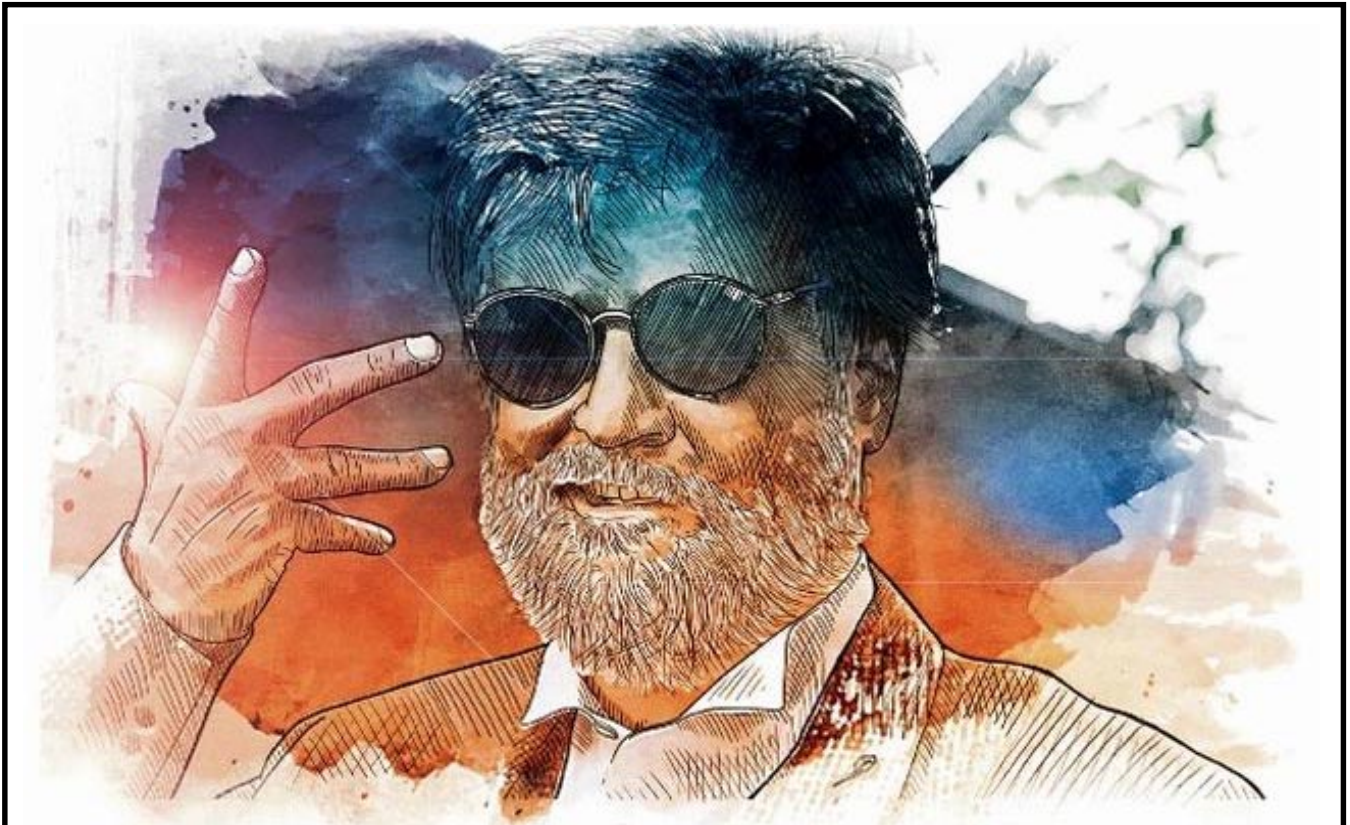
